\$1,000,000 Powerball Ticket Remains Unclaimed

TOPEKA, KAN. – An unclaimed \$1,000,000 Powerball ticket sold in Kansas is just under seven months from expiring. The lucky ticket is from the December 29, 2018 drawing.

The Powerball ticket was sold in south central Kansas which includes the following counties: Barton, Stafford, Pratt, Barber, Rice, Reno, Kingman, Harper, McPherson, Harvey, Sedgwick, Sumner, Marion, Butler, Cowley and Chase.

The winning numbers in the December 29 drawing were 12-42-51-53-62 with a Powerball of 25.

The winner has 365 days from the date of the drawing to claim their prize. The winner can claim their prize at the Kansas Lottery headquarters located at 128 N. Kansas Avenue, Topeka, KS.

For security reasons, it is the Kansas Lottery's policy not to disclose the store where the winning ticket was sold until the ticket is claimed.

The Powerball jackpot for the Wednesday, June 5, 2019, drawing is a guaranteed \$40 million with a \$25.9 million cash option. This comes after a \$344.6 million Powerball jackpot ticket was sold in North Carolina during the Saturday, June 1 drawing. The 10X multiple is also in play Wednesday as part of the Power Play option.

On Wednesday, Kansas Lottery players also have a chance to win \$325,000 on Super Kansas Cash. Super Kansas Cash is a Kansas-only game and jackpots are paid in one lump sum.

Players get two plays for \$1 and there are eight ways to win. Players select five numbers from 1 to 32 and a Super Cash Ball number from 1 to 25.

Super Kansas Cash drawings are held every Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday at approximately 9:10 p.m. The deadline to buy a Super Kansas Cash ticket is 8:59 p.m. on draw days.
