Holiday Millionaire Raffle ALREADY Over Two-Thirds Sold; Second \$30,000 Early Bird Drawing This Sunday

TOPEKA, KAN. – The holidays may still be around the corner, but the Holiday Millionaire Raffle is in full swing, and Kansas Lottery players are excited about their chance to kick off 2023 by winning \$1 million!

The annual Holiday Millionaire Raffle is already two-thirds sold out as of October 31! That means less than 50,000 tickets are still available for purchase, and with the next \$30,000 Early Bird drawing coming on November 6, tickets will move quickly.

On January 4, 2023, the Kansas Lottery will announce the winning number for the \$1 million Grand Prize plus thousands of other prizes, including one \$100,000 winner, one \$25,000 winner, two \$10,000 winners, and more! Here are the prizes and the number of winners at each prize level:

The Grand Prize announcement will air on various television stations across Kansas at approximately 12 p.m. on January 4, 2023.

Each ticket has a unique six-digit number. Tickets are Quick Pick only and will print on terminals throughout the state in numerical order, from 000001 to 150000. Players must match their numbers in exact order to those drawn by the Lottery to win. Players should put their tickets in a safe place after purchase. Every ticket purchased is eligible to win in all subsequent Early Bird drawings and in the Grand

Finale drawing. Remember – winners must produce their original Holiday Millionaire Raffle tickets to claim their prizes!

Players are invited to submit all their winning and non-winning tickets in the Kansas Lottery PlayOn® Players Loyalty program to earn points for drawing entries and a chance to win cash and other prizes! PlayOn® is a registered trademark of Pollard Banknote Limited used under license.
